



Title: Cello Faculty Member

Summary of Position

The Community Music School at the Community Music Center of Boston is seeking a cello faculty member with availability to teach weekly on Saturdays and at least one other weekday to provide quality one-on-one 30-minute, 45-minute, and 60-minute music instruction to students ranging from elementary school age to adults. The faculty member will be a responsible, dependable, committed individual who will work diligently to help students meet both musical and non-musical goals.

- Be knowledgeable about CMCB's mission and policies
- Teach students according to curricular guidelines

Specific Responsibilities

Studio Management and Retention

- Manage teaching studio and work with Registration staff to resolve scheduling conflicts
- Prepare students for performance events and opportunities
- Hold at least one studio recital during the school year (may be separate or combined with another faculty's studio)
- Accurately update and maintain digital studio attendance sheets in a timely manner
- Maintain open and regular communication with parents and students via email to support educational progress
- Contact students and guardians if there are any unexpected personal absence



Communication and Participation

- Attend at least three paid Departmental meetings hosted by the relevant Faculty Instructional Lead, meetings hosted by the ECH Director when appropriate, and the annual all-faculty meeting as scheduled
- Participate in departmental events, competitions, recitals, and concerts while also encouraging students to attend
- Facilitate student participation in the annual Performathon fundraiser
- Administer and participate in annual department student evaluations
- Communicate clearly with Registration staff regarding teaching schedule changes
- Actively respond to pertinent emails from all CMCB staff in a timely manner
- Clarify curriculum expectations with the relevant Faculty Instructional Lead(s)
- Additional responsibilities as assigned by SDCMS and Strings FIL

- Minimum of 2 years teaching experience
- Experience working with diverse populations of students

- Bilingual (Spanish, Mandarin, or Cantonese) skills are a plus but not required
- Knowledge in a diverse range of styles preferred (i.e. Classical, Rock, Blues, Jazz, Folk, and/or Popular Music)
- Demonstrated experience teaching ages 4-7 in a group setting, and/or knowledge of early childhood strings pedagogies and general classroom management is preferred as additional opportunities are available for candidates experienced in working with Early Childhood populations in group class settings
