



Title: Brass Faculty (Trumpet/Horn)

Summary of Position

The Community Music School at the Community Music Center of Boston is seeking a brass faculty member specializing in either trumpet or horn with availability to teach in-person weekly on Saturday and one other weekday to provide quality one-on-one 30-minute, 45-minute, and 60-minute music instruction to students ranging from elementary school age to adults. The faculty member will be a responsible, dependable, committed individual who will work diligently to help students meet both musical and non-musical goals.

Status: Part-time hourly, exempt

Start Date: As soon as possible, no later than November 1, 2021

Schedule: 2-4 hours per week with room for growth, dependent upon registration

Reports to: Winds/Brass Faculty Instructional Lead (FIL)

Works Closely With: Senior Director of the Community Music School (SDCMS), Winds/Brass FIL, CMS Programs Coordinator, and Registration Staff

General Responsibilities

- Treat all students, school staff and coworkers with respect and dignity
- Be knowledgeable about CMCB's mission and policies
- Be an active and visible ambassador for CMCB in select targeted recruitment efforts in the community

Specific Responsibilities

Studio Management and Retention

- Teach students according to curricular guidelines
- Manage teaching studio and work with Registration staff to resolve scheduling conflicts
- Prepare students for performance events
- Facilitate student participation in available workshop opportunities
- Hold at least one studio recital during the school year (may be separate or combined with another faculty's studio)



- Accurately update and maintain digital studio attendance sheets in a timely manner
- Maintain open and regular communication with parents and students via email to support educational progress
- Contact students and guardians if there is an unexpected personal absence

Communication and Participation

- Attend at least three paid Departmental meetings hosted by the relevant Faculty Instructional Lead, meetings hosted by the ECH Director when appropriate, and the annual all-faculty meeting as scheduled
- Participate in departmental events, competitions, recitals, and concerts while also encouraging students to attend
- Facilitate student participation in the annual Performathon fundraiser
- Administer and participate in annual department student evaluations
- Communicate clearly with Registration staff regarding teaching schedule changes
- Actively respond to pertinent emails from all CMCB staff in a timely manner
- Clarify curriculum expectations with the relevant Faculty Instructional Lead(s)
- Additional responsibilities as assigned by SDCMS and Winds/Brass FIL

Essential Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in music performance or education with knowledge in the field of trumpet and/or horn performance/pedagogy or equivalent experience; candidates able to teach both are **highly** preferred
- Minimum of two years teaching experience
- Experience working with diverse populations of students
- Commitment to Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion as pedagogical and professional values
- Interest in the following focus areas:
 - Culturally Responsive Teaching
 - Creative Youth Development - Student Voice/Agency
 - Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)
- In person availability on Saturday and at least one other weekday, preferably Monday
- Ability to motivate and/or inspire others
- Excellent interpersonal skills (engaging and professional)
- Effective communication skills in conversing with students, families, and colleagues
- Demonstrated ability to actively listen to and learn from others
- Working knowledge of Google Suite (Google Docs, Google Forms, and Google Sheets)



- Must be able to move and distribute instruments and/or accompanying accessories weighing up to 20 pounds

Preferred Qualifications

- Bilingual (Spanish, Mandarin, or Cantonese) skills are a plus but not required
- Knowledge in a diverse range of styles preferred (i.e. Classical, Rock, Blues, Jazz, Folk, and/or Popular Music)
