What a year of evolution this has been for CMCB and our communities! As many of you know, in Spring 2024 we announced that **CMCB purchased a building in the Nubian Square neighborhood** of the historic Roxbury Cultural District. Upon the completion of the renovation in 2026, CMCB will own a flagship campus for arts education and creative youth development in Boston. With our continued commitment to maintaining space in our South End campus, both locations will provide lessons, classes, excellent teachers, and learner-centered curricula.

In our 114 year history, CMCB's headquarters have spanned different buildings, mergers, and developments. Throughout, one thing has remained the same: CMCB's commitment to **supporting over 150 schools and organizations in the last few decades alone.**

Our students, families, and teachers have filled every location to the brim with music, joy, and camaraderie. Now, as we move forward into becoming **owners rather than renters**, we take even more of our destiny into our own hands. As we continue to match money to mission, we are excited to **create beautiful spaces** where we can work with **more students**, where **more families** can gather, and where we can continue on our journey toward being ever more inclusive for our learners.

We also made significant strides in developing a more unified teaching philosophy via our **student pathways**, and our **youth employment program** created capstone opportunities for students to learn how to thrive in the boardroom and the front office just as they do on stage. We are proud to continue identifying ways in which our students and families can feel seen and heard as they move throughout CMCB's programs.

I have been especially touched as I have watched local community support become bolstered by support from major philanthropists via large-scale national initiatives. For example, CMCB was proud to be a **laureate of the Lewis Prize in 2023-24**, one of the most prestigious awards for creative youth development in America. As part of our final round interview, we gathered students, teachers, parents, and community volunteers for a five hour visit. We got to sit back and hear one moving story after another relayed to the Lewis Prize team from the people who matter most: our students, families, and teachers.

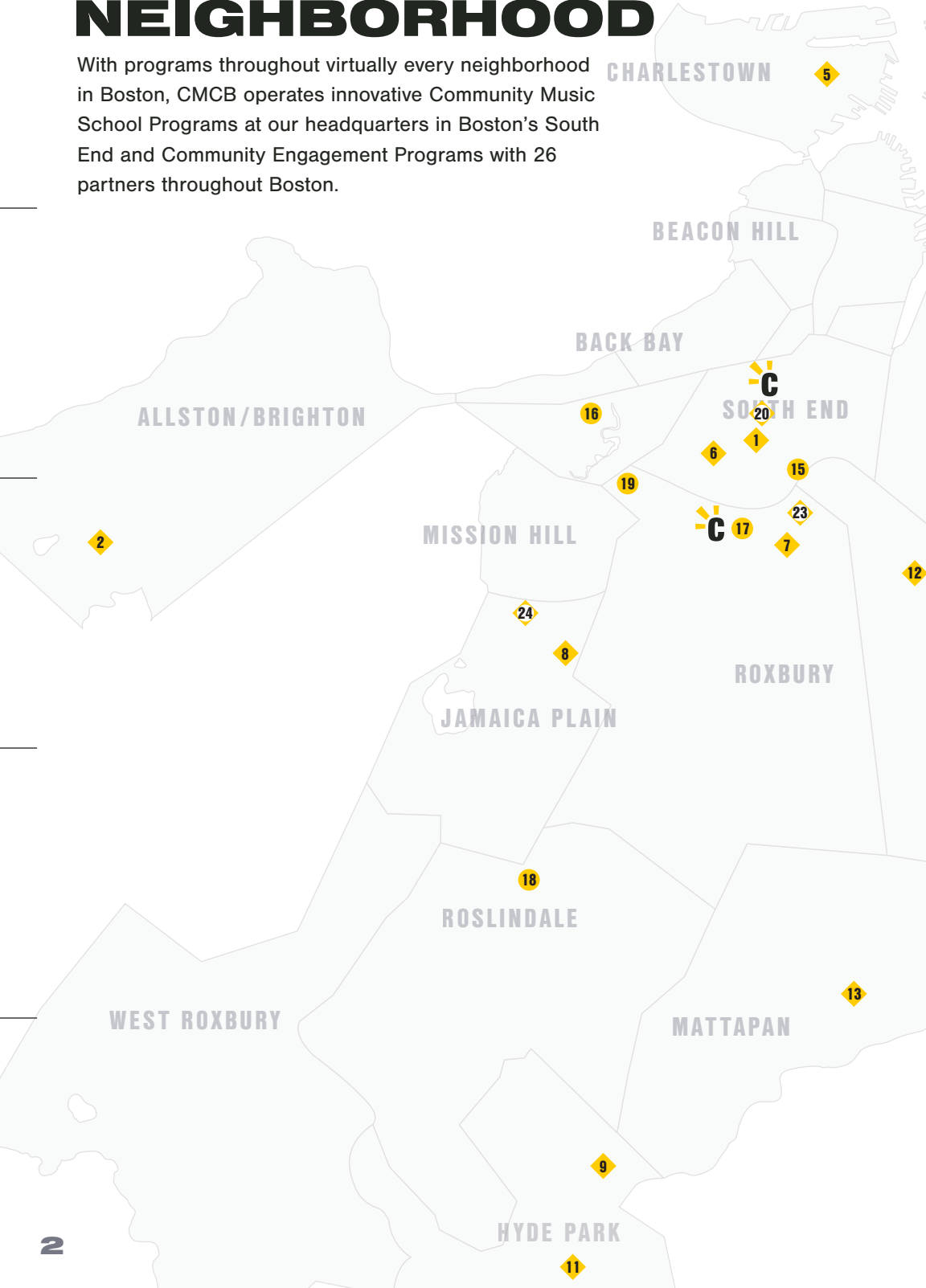

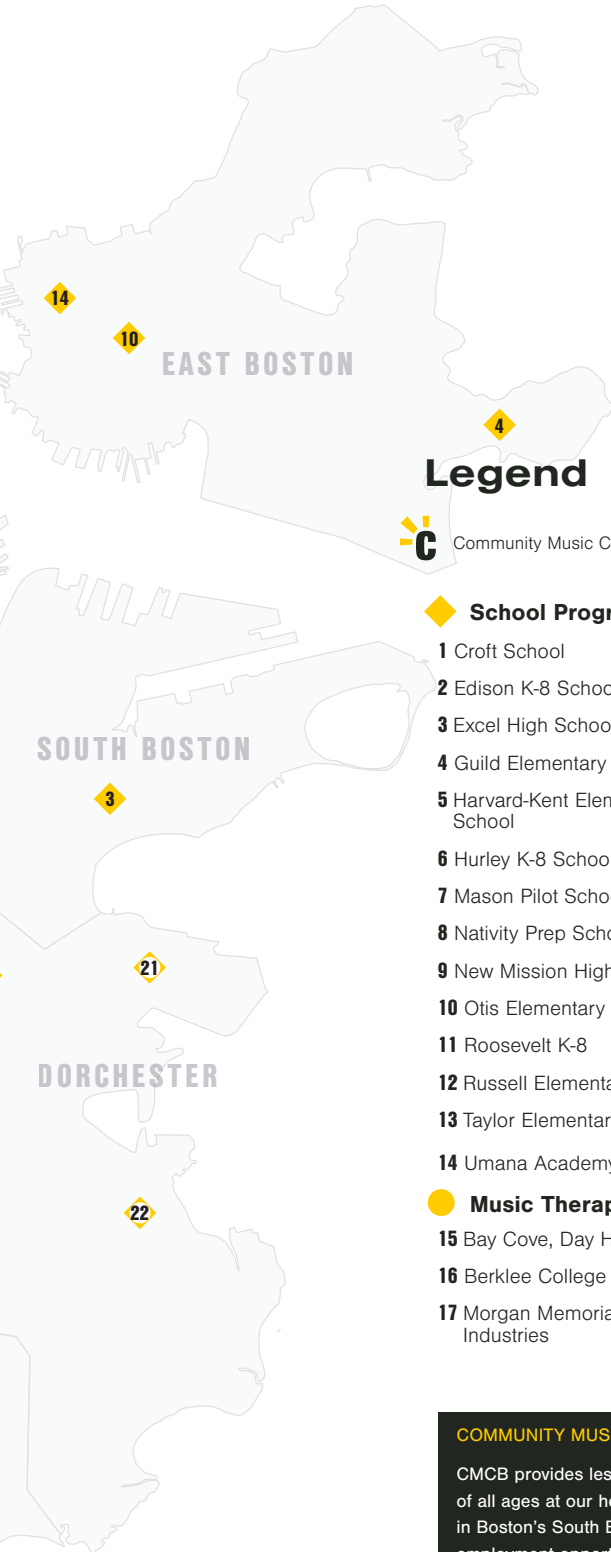

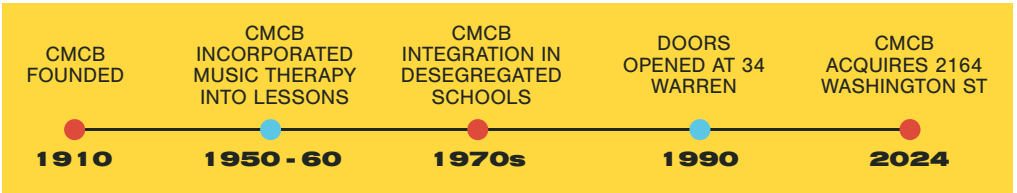
COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS (CEP)

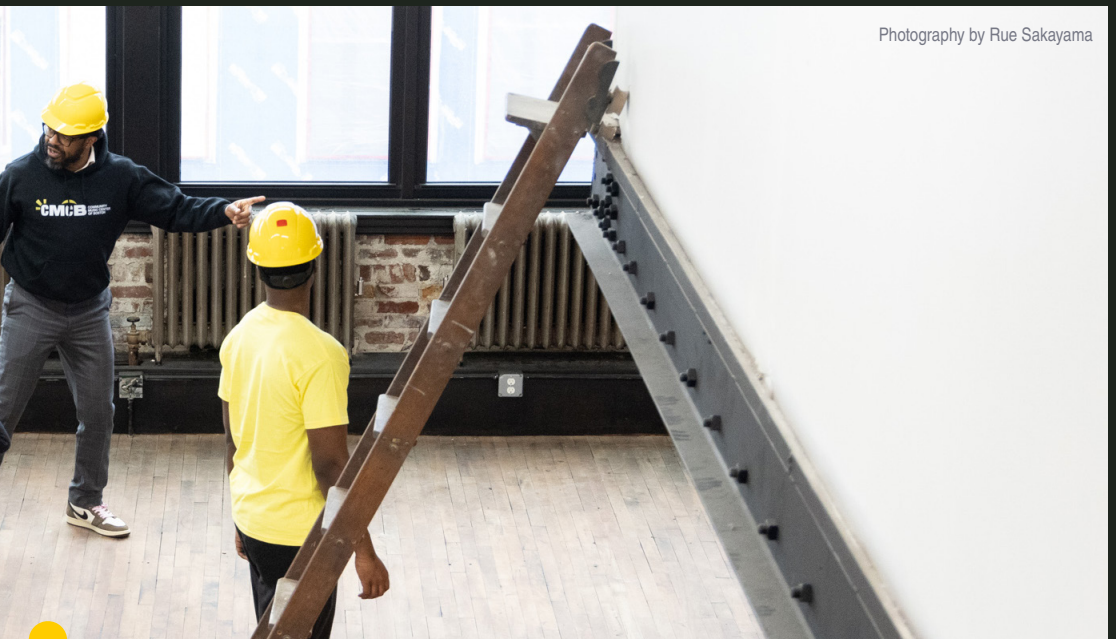

YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AT CMCB

Since its creation in 2020, our Youth Employment program continues to blossom! Just this year, we've received significant recognition as a **leader in youth empowerment** from organizations like the Lewis Prize, the National Endowment for the Arts, and EdVestors that have allowed us to invest more deeply in the program.

With this support, we've built **an entire team** dedicated to **supporting and advocating for our youth employees**. These full-time staff members have been an invaluable addition, creating better systems to help us meet the needs of these young leaders and celebrating each youth employee along the way. Our youth employees are such **integral members of the CMCB family**, and it is truly wonderful to be a part of their journeys as we grow alongside each other every day.

SONGWRITING AND RECORDING WITH PARTNERS FOR YOUTH WITH DISABILITIES (PYD) AT THE RECORD CO (TRC)

This April break, we teamed up with PYD and TRC to host an incredible **weeklong songwriting and recording workshop** just for PYD participants. Each day, English and Spanish-speaking students dove into the world of music production, **crafting their own beats and learning the ropes** with the help of our amazing bilingual CMCB faculty members, Mark Perez and Carlos Herrand Pou. By the end of the week, these budding musicians created something truly unique—and we got to celebrate their hard work with a showcase, **surrounded by their families and friends**. Student Pathways

Every student pursues music for a different reason. Some of us came out of the womb with a deep love of music. Some of us heard our favorite band on the radio and begged our friends to start a group together. Some of us needed a new hobby and discovered our love of music later in life. Some of us saw a famous musician and said, "I want to be you when I grow up." We all have different points in our lives that connected us to the **possibilities of music** and allowed us to dream.

Unfortunately, some of us also had that initial musical flame quenched by a negative learning experience. It is all too common that schools and teachers can be unprepared to support the full potential of a student's musical journey. Many programs assume that all students have the same motivation for pursuing music, and, in doing so, turn students away from pursuing music at all. At CMCB, we **meet each student where they are** in their journey and understand that each student has a different musical purpose that evolves as they grow.

To **celebrate and formalize** these many musical possibilities, we worked with faculty and staff to create a new framework - our Student Pathways. These 4 musical pathways allow our students to have more agency in their musical journey at CMCB.

STUDENT PATHWAYS



Musical Explorers engage in the process of examining and being curious about sounds, rhythms and instruments.



Performing Musicians focus primarily on composing, conducting, or performing music with the goal of being competitive at a music college, conservatory, or solo competition.



Community Musicians work with people to enable them to actively enjoy and participate in music, with people who share common interests, experiences and backgrounds.



Citizen Musicians contribute to society either through the transformative power of their artistic abilities, or through other areas of engagement including education, community building, social justice-themed projects, diplomacy, and healthcare.

After months of research on these pathways, we've released **two landmark reports** about teaching and learning at CMCB! One co-authored with Tavis Linsin, PhD of Creative Inquiry Labs focuses on the **design and development** of these new models and related teacher training. The other, co-authored with impact evaluation firm WolfBrown, carries this research further, analyzing **how students relate** to each pathway. We officially announced these reports in June where we heard from Executive Director, Lecolion Washington, Tavis Linsin, and our much-loved teachers who shared how they worked together—alongside students, staff, parents, and national experts—to design and roll out CMCB's Student Pathways Program. We're so proud to continue championing these musical pathways and supporting our students wherever their musical journey takes them!

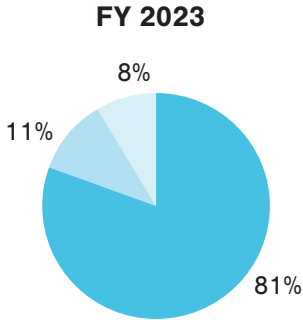

Total = \$7.43M

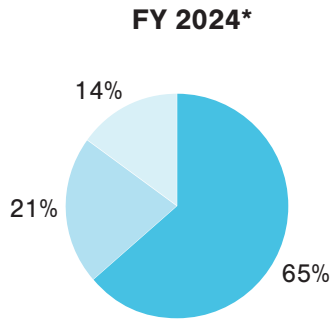

Earned

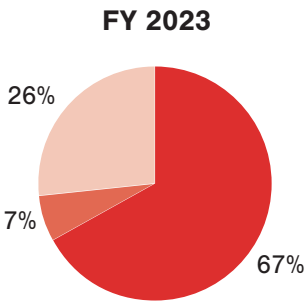


Investments & Other

Total = \$3.35M

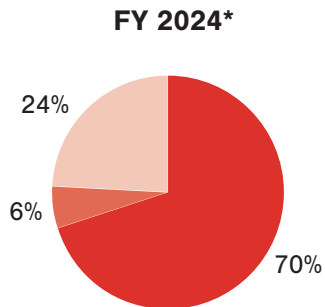

Occupancy



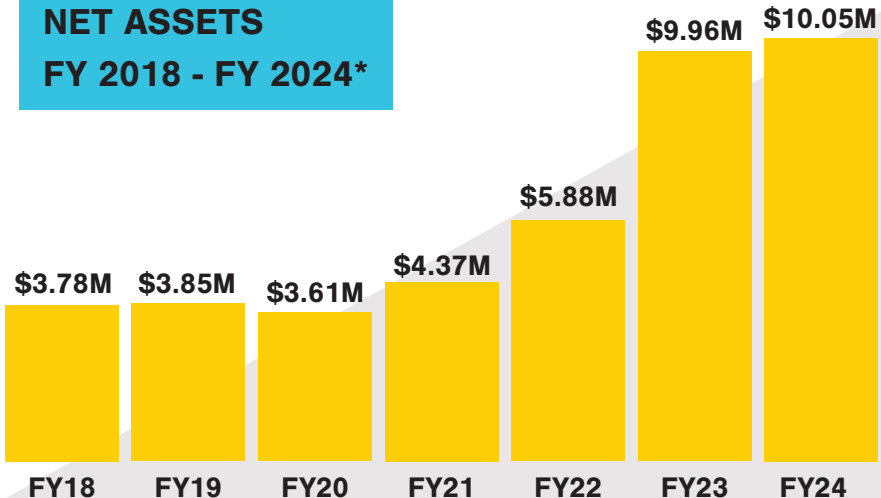
Operating Expenses
